On your PSR, verify your most recent FITREP is present and there are no FITREP gaps. It is vital to your career progression to ensure your record is permanently updated. Waiting to submit a Letter to the Board (LTB) when you are up for screening a milestone will only update your record temporarily for that specific board.

CVN & FIDE Tours:

Another opportunity is available for 1st tour Division Officers to receive a guided tour of a CVN and the FIDE (Fleet Interactive Display Equipment). The FIDE is a full scale simulator of a CVN propulsion plant control room where you'll be standing watch in your CVN tour. The tours will be offered during working hours. Your chains of command will be informed of the tours but please work with them to ensure your ship can support when operational commitments allow.

MTT XO Billet:

Billet in the Spotlight! Do you want to stay in Norfolk? Do you want to help your fellow SWO(N) Divos be successful while simultaneously enjoying an incredibly flexible work schedule? Talk to your RO about MTT XO. While there is some travel involved (not as much as you probably think), when not conducting a visit, you'll have very reasonable working hours. This job provides ample flexibility to complete a Master's Degree, and plenty of time to recharge after sea duty. I strongly encourage you to discuss with your RO and any available CNAL N9 reps today!

For the more data-driven among us (just kidding, that's all of us):

Working Hours, Leave, and Liberty Opportunities:

- Liberal in port working hours, with an emphasis on objective based workdays. It is extremely rare for MTT personnel, other than the OIC and RDMC, to be in the office before 0830 or after 1400. In addition, every effort is made to maintain Friday as an off-day for MTT members other than the OIC and RDMC.
- Protected leave periods during the winter holiday period, spring, and summer. In addition, the MTT schedule adopts the AIRLANT holiday special liberty policy when it does not conflict with ship visits. On the rare occasions when visits overlap a holiday weekend, the team is compensated.
- In a 2023, 41 of 52 weekends were or are projected to be open for MTT personnel.

Support of the Deployed CVN (Overseas Travel):

- In CY 2023, all MTT personnel with the exception of the OIC will execute four overseas ship visits (JAN, MAR, JUN, AUG).
- Visits are approximately 8 days
- 4-5 days on board CVN; 3-4 days to support travel to and from the ship.
- Travel to and from overseas is by commercial air and lodging is typically off-base, allowing for MTT personnel to accrue points with major airlines and hotel chains.

- A full rest day is built into the travel itinerary to support R&R of MTT personnel. On the rest day, MTT personnel sightsee in small groups and visit overseas venues that are unique to the area.

Major Command COBO Policy:

A new revision of the Nuclear Officer Bonus and Incentive Pay Program was recently signed. The only change that affected SWO(N)s are those that are serving or have served as a Major Commander. The previous revision of the instruction stated that a SWO(N) had to be at 26 YCS and be serving or have served as a Major Commander to receive the \$50K rate annual bonus. The new instruction allows receiving the \$50K bonus once serving in Major Command.
