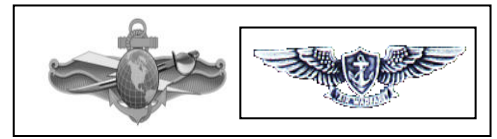




AG CAREER PATH (IW/AW)



Aerographer's Mates (AG). AGs are the Navy's Meteorological and Oceanographic (METOC) experts, trained in the science of meteorology and physical oceanography. AGs provide full spectrum forecast of meteorological and oceanographic conditions, and prepare and present briefings concerning environmental impacts and effects on military operations.

1. AG-A1” School and a valid security clearance is required.
2. The METOC Community is aligned under different warfare areas. These areas include Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW); Mine Warfare (MIW); Strike Warfare (STW); Naval Special Warfare (NSW); Aviation (AVN); and Maritime (MAR). Some commands are sea duty intensive that provide direct support to deployed units (SGOT, NOAC, NOSW), while others are primarily shore-based with Reach-Back Cell (RBC), providing 24/7 worldwide support (FWCs, NOOC). NAVO. FST and NOMWC offer sea duty in the form of deployable “fly-away” teams. AGs will typically work in several warfare areas during their career.
3. AGs may qualify for multiple warfare designation (EIWS/EAWS/ESWS/EXWS/SG/NAO) based upon assignment/platform type
4. AGs follow a sea/shore flow of 36/36 and should be maintained unless otherwise articulated in evaluation

1. Sea Assignments (all)

- Strong documented leadership and mission impact serving in key leadership positions
- Should have served as LPO
- Qualified Journeyman Forecaster (J00A NEC)
- Expert in forecasting specified tactical mission set

- Master Training Specialist (MTS) qualification if having filled or currently in an 805A NEC Billet.
- Qualified EIWS if having been or currently in command where program is available
- Other Enlisted Warfare qualifications are expected if at a command with opportunity to qualify
- Should be qualified JOOD/OOD(I/P) and/or ABWC/BWC in an operational construct
- DCTT team or other Training Team member. Repair Locker Leader or other Damage Control organization involvement
- Managed a Command Collateral Duty (e.g. ACFL, DAPA, CMEO, UPC) with documented impact
- FCPOA leadership or influential peer group involvement
- Sailor 360 involvement, preferably leading with documented impact
- Should have served as LPO

- Qualified as a Master Forecaster
- Qualified EIWS
- Other Enlisted Warfare qualifications are expected if at a command with opportunity to qualify
- Master Training Specialist (MTS) qualification if having filled or currently in an 805A NEC Billet
- Section Leader, 3MC and others outside the normal scope
- DCTT team or other Training Team member. Repair locker leader or other Damage Control organization involvement.
- Managed a Command Collateral Duty (: e.g.ACFL, DAPA, CMEO, UPC) with documented impact
- CPOA leadership, preferably an elected position with documented impact or peer group involvement
- Sailor 360 involvement, preferably leading with documented impact
- CPO Initiation involvement, preferably a committee lead with documented impact

- AGs are assigned to LCSs for the MIW mission module; LCS is a modularized ship; all Sailors assigned, including AGs, are expected to have varying roles based on ship's mission.
- AGs assigned as CCCs are considered experts in their rate and are selected for this additional command responsibility.

- Section Leader DCTT team or other Training Team member, Repair Locker Leader and arduous duty assignments outside the normal scope
- Master Training Specialist (MTS) qualification if having filled or currently in an 805A NEC Billet.
