Must be certified as Class II swimmer prior to completion of Recruit Training, with the potential of qualifying as Class I swimmer during AW training. Rescue swimmer and sea-air rescue training included in AW guarantee, therefore, strong swimmers are desired. Normal color and depth perception. Vision must correct to 20/20 in both eyes and correction must be worn. In accordance with reference (e), Article 15-92, applicants must meet the hearing standards for Student Naval Aviator (SNA) (refer to chart below). No speech impediment.
