

# PURPOSE

This playbook provides enlisted personnel with a comprehensive guide to transitioning into officer roles within the Navy. It outlines eligibility criteria, available programs, and the administrative steps required for a successful application.

# **★★ ELIGIBILITY ★★**

To qualify for commissioning programs, applicants must meet the following requirements:



#### **U.S. CITIZENSHIP**

Required for all applicants



#### **GOOD MORAL CHARACTER**

No disciplinary actions within the past three years



## PHYSICAL QUALIFICATIONS

Must pass medical and fitness standards



#### PROGRAM-SPECIFIC REDUIREMENTS

Vary by program and may include age limits, educational prerequisites, and service commitments

## **AVAILABLE** COMMISSIONING **PROGRAMS**

## **U.S. NAVAL ACADEMY** (USNA) & NAVAL ACADEMY PREPARATORY SCHOOL (NAPS)


- Designed for younger candidates pursuing a bachelor's degree and an officer commission
- Requires strong academic and physical preparation
- Must be 17–23 years old on July 1 of the entry year
- Must be unmarried, not pregnant, and have no parental obligations
- Requires nomination from an official source (e.g., Secretary of the Navy, Congress)





## OFFICER CANDIDATE SCHOOL

- For candidates holding a bachelor's degree
- ✓ Intensive 12-week training program
- Must be at least 19 years old and within designator-specific age limits
- Requires two consecutive "good-low" PRT scores
- Must be recommended by the Commanding Officer (CO)





## **AVAILABLE COMMISSIONING PROGRAMS**

## **MEDICAL ENLISTED COMMISSIONING PROGRAM (MECP)**

- Focused on obtaining a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) and joining the Navy Nurse Corps
- Must complete BSN within 36 months
- Must be on active duty in the Navy, Marine Corps, or Navy Reserve
- Maximum age of 42 at the time of commissioning





## AIR VEHICLE PILOT WARRANT OFFICER (WO) PROGRAM


- Between 19 and 32 years old at the time of commissioning
- Minimum associate degree (2 years) from an accredited institution; transcripts required.
- Current or prior enlisted applicants must have less than 12 years of total service at the time of commissioning.
- Must score 96 or higher on the Selection of UAS Personnel (SUPer) Battery.





## CYBER WARRANT OFFICER (WO) PROGRAM

- Open to enlisted personnel in the CTN rating at pay grade E5 or higher
- Requires 6–12 years of service
- Must possess specific NECs: H13A, H14A, H15A, or H16A






## **AVAILABLE COMMISSIONING PROGRAMS**

## LIMITED DUTY OFFICER (LDO) & CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER (CWO) PROGRAMS

- ✓ Provides technical leadership roles without requiring a bachelor's degree
- LDO: Minimum of 8 years and a maximum of 14-16 years of active duty service
- CWO: Must be E7–E9 with 14–22 years of active duty service
- Requires high school diploma or GED





## MEDICAL SERVICE CORPS IN-SERVICE PROCUREMENT PROGRAM (MSC IPP)

- Designed for healthcare specialists pursuing advanced degrees
- Open to active duty enlisted personnel (E5-E9)
- Maximum age of 42 at the time of commissioning
- Not available to Reservists on short-term recalls







## **SEAMAN TO ADMIRAL-21 (STA-21)**

- Combines university education with leadership training
- Must be under 27 years old at commissioning (waivers available up to 29)
- Requires SAT/ACT scores meeting minimum thresholds (SAT: 500 Math, 500 Critical Reading; ACT: 21 Math, 20 English)
- Must be recommended by the CO







## STEP 1:

## APPLICATION PREPARATION

Work with your Command Career Counselor (CCC), Education Service Officer (ESO), recruiter, or program representative to:

- Gather required documents (e.g., transcripts, SAT/ACT scores, personal statements)
- Ensure all eligibility requirements are met
- Address any program-specific prerequisites

## STEP 2: SUBMISSION

- Complete and submit your application package by the specified deadlines
- Follow all program-specific guidelines carefully

## STEP 3: SELECTION BOARD REVIEW

Applications are evaluated based on:

- Leadership potential
- Academic achievements
- Physical readiness

## STEP 4: FINAL DECISION

- Selected candidates receive notification and instructions for training or academic enrollment
- Non-selected candidates may reapply if eligibility is maintained



## **★★ SERVICE ★★ OBLIGATIONS**

#### **USNA/NAPS GRADUATES:**

5 years active duty + 3 years reserve

#### OCS GRADUATES:

Minimum of 4 years active duty

#### MECP + MSC IPP GRADUATES:

8-year obligation (4 active duty, 4 reserve)

#### LDO/CWO PROGRAMS:

3–4 years active duty, depending on program specifics

## **NOTIFICATION PROCESS**

- Fleet processors email results to the applicant's Chain of Command (CoC)
- Select and Non-Select results are sent to **BUPERS**
- Applicants can check board results in **BOL** (posting times vary)
- Ship date confirmation is required from the applicant's command

#### **KEY CONTACTS**

- Command Career Counselor (CCC): Primary resource for application guidance and qualification verification
- Educational Service Officer (ESO): Provide guidance similar to the CCC
- **Recruiters:** Provide program-specific details and assist with submission
- **Program Representatives:** Offer in-depth information on requirements and timelines

## **IMPORTANT NOTES**

- Deadlines and eligibility requirements may change annually
- Always refer to the latest program instructions and NAVADMIN updates
