

Navy Diver (ND). NDs perform underwater salvage, recovery, repair, and maintenance on ships and submarines; search for and recover downed aircraft; conduct harbor clearance operations; provide assistance to military, federal, state, and local civilian law enforcement agencies in diving operations and procedures; maintain and repair diving equipment and systems; research and develop new diving techniques and procedures; conduct submarine rescue operations; maintain forms, records, correspondence, and files; and perform and supervise recompression chamber operations, hyperbaric treatment for diving and non-diving illnesses, open and closed-circuit Underwater Breathing Apparatus (UBA) diving, saturation diving, surface-supplied air and mixed-gas diving operations, demolition operations, and small arms proficiency.

Note 1: The ND rating maintains a balanced sea/shore rotation. NDs are expected to maintain regular sea/shore flow and demonstrate leadership in all assigned billets. Due to the demanding nature of most shore billets, sea/shore rotation should not be the primary factor for tour selection.

Notes:

- 1. The ND rating is comprised of three tiered NECs. Each NEC represents increasing levels of knowledge and responsibility. "A" or "C-school" is required for attainment of each NEC.
 - a. M2DV Second Class Diver (Apprentice Skill set)
 - b. M1DV First Class Diver (Journeyman Skill set)
 - c. MMDV Master Diver (Master Skill set)
- 2. Diving Warfare Specialist (DWS) Qualification:
 - a. NEC M2DV- IAW COMNECCINST 1414.3F, ND personnel with NEC M2DV will have 24 months to complete initial DWS qualification upon reporting to their first command after graduation of Second Class Dive School.
 - b. NEC M1DV- IAW COMNECCINST 1414.3F, ND personnel with NEC M1DV must renew DWS qualifications within 18 months of reporting on board.
 - c. NEC MMDV IAW COMNECCINST 1414.3F, ND personnel with NEC MMDV are considered permanently DWS qualified.

Considerations for advancement from E6 to E7 (by order of precedence):

- Must have NEC M1DV (First Class Diver).
- Must have completed tours at both an Expeditionary and an Underwater Ship Husbandry (UWSH) command.
- Must successfully complete a minimum of 12 months in a LPO leadership position. The time between the
 evaluation end date and the date of the promotion board should be added to the calculation for time successfully
 served in the milestone position.
- Must have the core and 2 advanced qualifications IAW Qualifications (pg. 6).
- Should have the core qualification and 3 advanced qualifications IAW Qualifications (pg. 6). At least one advanced qualification must be a diving supervisor qualification.
- Should demonstrate excellence across all assigned diving commands, reflecting a varied background aligned with career path guidelines for PCS assignments within the Expeditionary, UWSH, and Training/Special Mission pillars.
- Many duty types offer the potential to attain qualifications, NEC's and warfare designations outside of DWS.
 ND's should take advantage of these opportunities to stay competitive for advancement (EXW, AW, SW, DOS, RSO, MTS, etc).
- Should have a minimum of three years of diving experience in NEC M1DV.
- Should have continued professional development, i.e. attending military schools, college courses, completing
 correspondence courses, PME/SEJPME, certifications, etc. Sailors earning their qualifications and academic
 achievements.
- Overseas (including Hawaii) and tours in varied geographic locations ARE considered career enhancing.
- Should demonstrate command-level involvement through collateral duties (e.g., DAPA, Command Fitness Leader (CFL), Assistant Command Fitness Leader (ACFL), CMEO, 3MC/3MA, Command Financial Specialist (CFS), Career Counselor), First Class Petty Officer Association (FCPOA), Sailor 360, and Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) participation.



Considerations for advancement from E7 to E8 (by order of precedence):

- NEC MMDV (Master Diver) has the highest priority above all others for selection to E8.
- Must have 8LDC to be eligible for advancement to E8.
- Must have documentation successfully passing the written Master Diver Course pre-test administered by the NAVDIVSALVTRACEN per MPM 1220-100.
- Must have completed at least 12 months as a Leading Chief Petty Officer (LCPO).
- Should have the core qualification and 4 advanced qualifications IAW Qualifications (pg 6). At least one advanced qualification must be a diving supervisor qualification. More advanced qualifications are considered career enhancing when having an impact on command mission.
- Should make significant contributions to ND rating NEC manning, and professional development. Ex: Selection board participation, Advancement Examination Readiness Review (AERR), ND PQS review board participation, Training Requirements Review (TRR), etc.
- Should have continued professional development, i.e. attending military schools, college courses, completing
 correspondence courses, certifications, SEJPME I & II and if available the Senior Enlisted Academy (Any Service).
 If college degree is completed, continuing to work toward next degree or some form of professional selfimprovement.
- Should have Command level involvement, i.e. Command collateral duties (DAPA, CLF. ACFL, CMEO, 3MC/3MA, CFS, Career Counselor, etc.), CPOA, CPO Initiation, Sailor 360 and MWR involvement.
- Should have a minimum of 5 years of diving experience in NEC M1DV.
- Overseas (including Hawaii) and tours in varied geographic locations ARE considered career enhancing
- NOTE: Diver First Class (NEC M1DV) personnel SEM screened for SCPO must be awarded NEC MMDV (Master Diver) before promotion to SCPO.

Considerations for advancement from E8 to E9 (by order of precedence):

- Must have NEC MMDV (Master Diver) and 8SEA (or equivalent) to be eligible for advancement to E9.
- Should have completed a minimum 36 months of service as a Master Diver.
- Should make significant contributions to ND rating, NEC manning, and professional development. Ex: Selection board participation, Advancement Examination Readiness Review (AERR), ND PQS review board participation, Training Requirements Review (TRR), etc.
- Should be excelling in primary duties. Achieve mastery level, Sailors excelling under their lead (SOY/JSOY/BJOY/MAPs, advancements, qualifications, education, self-improvement etc.), documented success as DLCPO, LCPO, and in mentorship.
- Should make significant contributions to Master Diver development: Pre-screener coordinator, Master Diver MDV Evaluator, Pre-screener participant.
- Tours in varied geographic locations ARE considered career enhancing.



Qualifications: A diverse background across all commands will ensure that a Navy Diver has had the opportunity to obtain a wide variety of qualifications to attain ND's core qualification and advanced qualifications.

Note 1: Qualifications are not in order of precedence or priority.

Note 2: The qualification/term "Unlimited Diving Supervisor" is not a valid qualification. Each specific diving system or diving apparatus is a separate qualification and should be spelled out that way in designation letters and evaluations.

Note 3: The long and abbreviated title was change implemented in 2023. Legacy titles/ abbreviations prior to 2023 are still valid qualifications.

Note 4: * Qualifications: For "Electronically Controlled Close-Circuit Underwater Breathing Apparatus (EC-UBA) Supervisor" and "*Closed Circuit Oxygen UBA (CC-UBA) Supervisor" a-c listed qualification listed below count as one advanced qualification.
