



Fire Controlmen (FC). FCs are technicians responsible for the operation, maintenance, testing, troubleshooting and repair of: RADARs, computers, networks, data display systems and integrated weapon system components. Fire Controlmen are knowledgeable in basic electricity/electronics, digital fundamentals, synchros, servos, RADAR principals, the fire control problem, gun ballistics, missile systems and computer fundamentals. FCs serve on most classes of surface ships and are trained in maintenance and operation of variety of weapon systems.

Notes:

- 1. "A" School and Security Clearance is required.
- 2. Sailors MUST qualify at the level of their respective paygrade to become "FULLY QUALIFIED". It is highly recommended that FCs qualify at a higher paygrade, attain higher level of qualifications, and seek greater responsibilities at their command reaching "BEST QUALIFIED". Commands are different in nature, mission, operational tasking, qualifications, equipment, etc. and you should review the considerations for advancement notes for each paygrade.
- 3. FCs assigned to billets that offer an Enlisted Warfare designations must attain the respective qualification and be qualified to their appropriate paygrade to be considered "FULLY before BEST QUALIFIED" at their current command.
- 4. FCs assigned to Instructor Duty/Course Supervisor/SCSTC billets where ATS and MTS are offered attain the respective qualification and be qualified to their appropriate paygrade to be considered "FULLY before BEST QUALIFIED" at their current command. It should not be seen as negative if the Sailor has not been onboard long enough to reach the qualification deadline.





- 5. Forward Deployed Naval Forces (FDNF) Shore/Sea billets are extremely arduous in nature, have a higher operational commitment and deploy at a much higher rate than CONUS Shore/Sea billets. FCs assigned to these hard to fill billets should be given special consideration by the selection board.
- 6. Instructor Duty and Training Support Center billets can prevent a member from being in a leadership position. This fact is due to the sheer number of Chief Petty Officer and First Class billets at schoolhouses and Afloat Training Groups.
- 7. Typically, on smaller platforms, FCs are substantially involved in ATTT, it is expected that all should have a role in CSTT and expand into other Training Teams as well.
- 8. Billet base for E5 imbalanced for shore duty, which may preclude a Sailor's opportunity for an in-rate shore tour. Sailors electing to stay at sea might not follow normal sea-shore flow.
- 9. Tours at NPC and BUPERS (detailer), RTC, OTC, and Naval Academy as a Recruit Division Commander require special screening, are highly competitive in nature and are high priority assignments.
- 10. The Littoral Combat Ship (LCS) uses a Train to Qualify (T2Q) concept. Sailors will be in a T2Q (ACC 106) status while they receive up to 18 months of required training. Periodic and transfer evaluations while in T2Q will normally be "Not Observed" or lack competitive rankings. T2Q time does not count toward sea tour requirement. Sea shore flow may appear abnormal due to significant training time required. Unplanned losses may cause a Sailor to transfer from one crew to another crew and should not be seen as negative.
- a. LCS ISICs train and certify crews in most mission areas, similar to ATG in train to certify. LTF provides training normally conducted during basic and intermediate phases. LTF scores are equivalent to ATG level warfare area drills and inspections. It is important to note that not all LCS ISICs have an ATS/MTS program therefore this should not be seen as negative if the program is not offered.
- b. Per CNO direction, Surface Warfare (SUW), Antisubmarine Warfare (ASW), and Mine Warfare (MIW) Mission Packages permanently merged with "core" crews. This will reflect a mid-tour UIC shift and is not derogatory.
- 11. Zumwalt (ZUM) Class DDG Sailors are assigned to Zumwalt Training Facilities (ZTF) for 6 months. These Sailors will be ACC 341 status while they receive required training. Periodic and transfer evaluations during their time at ZTF will normally be "Not Observed" or will lack competitive rankings. Sea shore flow may appear abnormal due to significant training time required.
- 12. Fleet and Carrier Strike Group Staff (CSG) personnel with V20A, 740A, and or V41A NECs provide training and real-world tasking to Tomahawk capable platforms to include U.S. Army, U.S. Marine Corps, and FMS partner nations. Manning requirements for Staff billets require multiple E-6 billets, limiting leadership positions. Personnel are expected to support TLAM and Staff FIRES roles and consideration should be given to both. Maritime Operations Center (MOC) support roles such as Fleet Command Center Supervisor (FLEET), Assistant Battle Watch Captain (CSG/FLEET), and Force Tactical Action Officer (CSG) assist the Battle Watch Captain in providing FLEET Commander or STRIKE GROUP Commander for providing situational awareness as well as communicating operational level direction and control of operations.
- 13. Performance and rating knowledge are the foundation on which we advance. Whatever platform/command you are assigned, you will need to ensure you are **FULLY QUALIFED to advance to the next paygrade**. Influencing others to be successful, positively impacting the command, and above all showing **SUSTAINED SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE**.

In addition to the above career path, an FC is advanced due to their proven leadership, qualifications and performance against competition, regardless of billet assigned.

1. Sea/Shore Assignments:

- a. Manning structure aboard a ship and shore commands limits opportunity to serve in LPO positions. Others leadership positions such as Departmental 3MA, Duty Section Watchbill Coordinator or a leadership position within the FCPOA is highly recommended.
- b. Command level involvement:
 - Training Teams (CSTT/ATTT/VBSSTT/ITT/DCTT, etc.).
 - Collateral Duty Lead/Assistant Lead (CFL, UPC, DAPA, CRT, CTT, etc.) Break out if managing a command program with documented results.
 - Sailor 360 involvement, preferably leading a committee.
- c. Active FCPOA involvement, documented successful impact as FCPOA Officer, documented mentoring of Sailors.
- d. Professional/Personal Development: Military/College/Correspondence courses, PME/SEJPME, Navy COOL, USMAP and continued effort toward a degree.
- e. Attaining ATS/MTS where offered is required to be FULLY QUALIFIED. See note 4.
