881 CURRICULUM

Billet subspecialty coding is to be based on the minimum education/training/experience level required for optimum performance. Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) subspecialty coding is justified when, in addition to the general criteria stated in NAVPERS 15839 series (Manual of Navy Officer Manpower and Personnel Classification) Part B, the following specific criteria are satisfied:

1. Description of CSR Competencies. The listed CSRs are a set of quantifiable skills, traits and experiences that a subspecialist must possess to perform acceptably in a coded billet for the Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) subspecialty.

- a. CSR-1: Administrative and Civil Law.
- b. CSR 2: Criminal Law and Procedure.
- c. CSR 3: Joint Ethics Regulation/Standards of Conduct.
- d. CSR 4: Fiscal and Contract Law.
- e. CSR-5: National Security Law.
- f. CSR-6: Legal Assistance.

2. Applicable Officer Designator: 2500.

3. Applicable Billet Designator: 2500.

4. Educational and Significant Experience Criteria. Coded billets are authorized when the functions of the billet include the CSR competencies listed above. For additional clarification regarding definition of suffixes, refer to the NAVPERS 15839I, Vol 1.

Note 1: Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) P-coded billets are justified when the billet requires legal services involving administrative and civil law, ethics, military justice, fiscal law, and national security law. Specific focus may include law of military installations, standards of conduct/ethics, military personnel law, command authorities, government information practices, civil litigation, admiralty, relations with civil authorities, disciplinary proceedings, and legal assistance.

Note 2: Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) P-coded officers are authorized when the officer completes Advanced Military Law/Command Advice Curriculum 881 ESRs at the Army Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School. Subspecialty will not be given if academic writing requirement set forth in JAGINST 1520.1D is not completed. (NOTE: PERS 4416B will verify completion of the academic writing in coordination with Naval Justice School and the relevant SME prior to authorization of P-code.).

Note 3: Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) Q-coded officers are authorized when all of the following conditions are met:

- a. The officer satisfies all requirements for a 1201 P-code; and
- b. The officer has completed an assignment for a minimum of 18 months in at least one Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) P-coded billet.

Note 4: Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) S-coded billets are justified when the billet requires legal services involving administrative and civil law, ethics, military justice, fiscal law, and national security law. Specific focus may include law of military installations, standards of conduct/ethics, military personnel law, command authorities, government information practices, civil litigation, admiralty, relations with civil authorities, disciplinary proceedings, and legal assistance.

Note 5: Advanced Military Law/Command Advice (1201) S-coded officers are authorized when the following conditions are met:

a. Through experience the officers are recognized experts in military law. Advanced Command Advice specialists will be legal advisors who understand commanders' duties as leaders, combatants, and guardians of public property and personnel, and are prepared to advise/support commanders and their staffs in any aspect of these roles. These officers will have advanced experience across the spectrum of legal services including administrative and civil law, ethics, military justice, fiscal law, and national security law. Specific focus includes law of military installations, standards of conduct/ethics, military personnel law, government information practices, civil litigation/admiralty, relations with civil authorities, disciplinary proceedings, and legal assistance (family law, consumer law, and estate planning); and

b. The Officer has filled a P-coded billet for more than 18 months and has no Subspecialty Code in this field; or

c. FITREP reflects the officer has accomplished the task(s) indicated above for more than 18 months.
