Billet subspecialty coding is to be based on the minimum education/training/experience level required for optimum performance. National Security Law (1203) subspecialty coding is justified when, in addition to the general criteria stated in NAVPERS 15839 series (Manual of Navy Officer Manpower and Personnel Classification) Part B, the following specific criteria are satisfied:

- Description of Core Skill Requirement (CSR) Competencies. The listed CSRs are a set of
 quantifiable skills, traits and experiences that a subspecialist must possess to perform acceptably
 in a coded billet for the National Security Law (1203) subspecialty. The National Security Law
 subspecialty (1203) will provide a command with an officer who understands the fundamental
 concepts, and is familiar with the basic functional areas of National Security Law within the
 DON and the DoD. Specific capabilities and requirements include:
 - a. CSR-1: Public International Law
 - b. CSR-2: Law of Armed Conflict
- c. CSR-3: At least two of the following: (1) International Programs; (2) Law of the Sea;
 (3) Cyberspace Law; (4) Space Law; (5) Information Operations/Intelligence Law; (6)
 Admiralty/Maritime Law.
- 2. Applicable Officer Designator: 2500
- 3. Applicable Billet Designator: 2500
- Educational and Significant Experience Criteria. Coded billets are authorized when the functions of the billet include the CSR competencies listed above (in paragraph 1). For additional clarification regarding definition of suffixes, refer to the NAVPERS 15839I, Vol 1.

Full subspecialty will not be given if academic writing requirement is not completed. (NOTE: When academic writing requirement has been completed, student must apply to NPS registrar for new transcript which should be forwarded to PERS-43 to update Officer Master File.)

P-coded <u>billets</u> are justified when the billet requires significant qualitative and qualitative national security law expertise.

Note 2: An <u>officer</u> is authorized an S code when the officer has acquired significant quantitative and qualitative national security law experience; demonstrated proficiency in national security law concepts; and the officer's FITREP reflects that the officer has accomplished the tasks indicated above for more than 18 months.
