

Physical Requirements



BY PST Minimum Requirements

> 500 yard Swim: 12:30 max

> 2 min Push-Ups: 50 min

> 2 min Sit-Ups: 50 min

> Max Pull-Ups: 6 min

> 1.5 Run: 12:30 max

*** Swim + Run ≤ 21:00 ***
