

Interservice Transfer

The Screening Panel selects a very limited number of officers from the Army, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Public Health Service, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration for re-designation as 1180 and follow-on SEAL training. Interested applicants must be aware of requirements associated with inter-service transfers, as outlined in [MILPERSMAN 1300-082](#). Applicants should work with the SEAL OCM to ensure their packages are complete and properly submitted.

Specific inter-service transfer eligibility requirements

- Less than 3 Years of Commissioned Service: more senior officers do not have the ability to complete career milestones based on seniority.
- Must be on permanent active duty throughout the selection and transfer process.

Applicants must complete one of the following to successfully complete their interservice transfer application:

1. Attend SEAL Officer Assessment and Selection (SOAS) at NSW Center in Coronado, CA during the summer of 2019. Applicants who have attended SOAS previously will be allowed one additional opportunity to attend. SOAS is a two week course, however this time commitment may be modified for lateral transfer candidates to accommodate operational commitments (SOAS would be approximately 10 days). Contact the OCM office or SOAS Program Manager (LT (Ret.) Andrew Dow, andrew.dow.ctr@socom.mil) for details and dates.
2. If they cannot attend SOAS, they will conduct a VTC or in-person interview with members of the SOAS staff. Interviews are a last resort and are intended for candidates who cannot attend events due to operational commitments. In the applicant's CO endorsement letter please include reason for not being available to attend SOAS (i.e. deployment, underway, etc.). The interview will count as a SOAS attempt, so candidates should carefully consider their options prior to committing to an interview.

4. Officer Data Card: must be returned to the SEAL OCM as Excel file in this [format](#).
5. Report of Applicant Screening: [PST Test Results Form](#). PST should be conducted within 6 months of package submission, administered by your NROTC OIC, SEA, or NSW representative.
6. Resume or Curriculum Vitae. There is no specific format required. **Include accurate contact information.**
7. Official College Transcript. Please do not mail transcripts to the OCM office. PDF Copies of official transcript is acceptable for the application.
8. Copy of Master Personnel Record.
9. Copies of all officer Fitness Reports/Evaluations.
10. No more than two (2) Letters of Reference (LOR): [This is the official format for LORs](#).

12. Source of Original Commission Documentation
12. [DD2807](#): medical history. Please ask about the SOAS medical form prior to completing the DD2807.
13. [DD2808](#): medical exam stamped PQ for diving duty.
