RMKS/1. This message announces education opportunities through the Center of Excellence in Logistics and Technology (LOGTECH) Institute for Defense and Business (IDB), hosted by Eastern Carolina University during fiscal year 2025 (FY25). LOGTECH enables and energizes participants to improve operations and accelerate adoption of future logistics capabilities throughout their organizations.

IDB offers courses in subparagraphs (a) and (b), available to Navy military and civilian personnel:

a. LOGTECH Executive Course. This course is available for military Flag Officers and Senior Executive Service members to focus on strategic and organizational considerations from the senior executive perspective. There are no further offerings of the Executive Course in FY25.

b. LOGTECH Advanced Course. This course is available for O-4 to O-6, CWO-4 to CWO-5, and E-9 military members; and GS-13 to GS-15 civilian personnel. It explores leading-edge logistics technologies to prepare logisticians for the future. FY25 Advanced Course schedule:

2. LOGTECH Package. To obtain LOGTECH Advanced Course quotas, applicants must submit a standard Navy biography and signed SF-182 to the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations, Installations and Logistics (DCNO N4) LOGTECH course managers. Advanced course applicants must also include a logistics problem statement for exploration during the course.

a. Problem statements must reflect the applicant's own analysis and insight. The use of AI tools (e.g. ChatGPT, Grammarly) is permitted to support idea generation, editing, or research, but any use must be clearly disclosed within the submission. A sample problem statement is found in reference (a).

3. LOGTECH Selection Process. Selections are based on the following criteria: funding availability, candidate qualifications (specifically career field and paygrade), package completeness (biography, SF-182, and problem statement), and quality of problem statement. 4. Funding. Tuition, meals, and lodging are centrally funded in FY25. Commands are responsible for funding travel, full per diem on travel days, and incidental per diem on non-travel days. Services, Agencies, and Combatant Commands also have the option to self-fund seats for any of the above classes. Should a command decide to self-fund, they will work directly with IDB after coordinating with the DCNO N4 Navy LOGTECH Course Managers. The program cost is \$9K per attendee and covers tuition, meals, and lodging.
