RMKS/1.This NAVADMIN announces October 2025 as Cybersecurity Awareness Month (CSAM) and emphasizes the U.S. Navy's commitment to strengthening our cyber defenses. This year's theme is "Fortify and Defend Lethality."

2. The cyber domain is a critical battlespace. Our ability to project power, maintain readiness and achieve operational superiority depends on a secure and resilient cyber environment. Our collective effort is essential to maintaining a decisive advantage against adversaries.

3. "Fortify and Defend Lethality" highlights the direct correlation between cybersecurity and our warfighting capabilities. A compromised system can impair our weaponry, disrupt communications and expose critical information, ultimately affecting our lethality.

4. Key focus areas for CSAM 2025 include:

- a. Threat awareness: stay informed about emerging cyber threats and tactics used by adversaries. Understand the potential impact of compromised systems on our operational capabilities. Report suspicious activity immediately.
- b. Practice good cyber hygiene: regularly update passwords; enable Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA); and be vigilant against phishing attempts. Adhere to security protocols for all devices and systems. References (a) and (b) provide detailed guidance on cybersecurity best practices.
- c. Secure remote work: follow established guidelines for secure remote access, including using Government-Issued Devices, Encrypted Connections (VPNs) and maintaining a secure home network. Be mindful of surroundings when discussing sensitive information.
- d. Protect classified information: strictly adhere to data transfer policies and report any potential data spillage immediately.
- e. Cybersecurity awareness: actively participate in cybersecurity awareness opportunities for additional education to enhance your cyber skills and knowledge.

5. Commands are encouraged to plan and execute CSAM activities throughout October, including:

a. Cybersecurity awareness events.

b. Posters and educational materials that display key cybersecurity messages.

6. All hands are reminded that cybersecurity is everyone's responsibility. Our collective vigilance is the first line of defense. We must continuously strive to improve our cyber posture and maintain a strong defense against cyber threats.

7. Commands are encouraged to disseminate this message widely throughout their chain of command.
