1. Purpose

- a. To issue policy for application procedures and administration of the Reserve Component (RC) and Active Component (AC) Career Recruiter Force (CRF) communities.
- b. Major revisions to this instruction include updated application process, incorporated NAVCRUIT 1133/29 CRF Conversion Board Recruiter Statistics Worksheet to provide objective evaluation of recruiter's performance, and expanded CRF conversion application eligibility. This instruction is a complete revision and should be read in its entirety.
- 2. Cancellation. BUPERSINST 1133.29M.
- 3. <u>Scope and Applicability</u>. This instruction applies to enlisted AC and RC canvasser recruiter personnel requesting lateral conversion into the CRF Program.
- 4. <u>Background</u>. The CRF was established in 1978 to develop a cadre of exceptional recruiting managers to provide consistency and leadership to the Navy's recruiting effort. Due to the distinct purpose and unique nature of duties involved in the CRF, the quality of personnel

selected is of paramount importance and requires strict adherence to eligibility criteria, procedures, and policy for conversion to CRF. Navy Recruiting Command (NAVCRUITCOM) manages the qualifications and career path of the CRF community. Bureau of Naval Personnel (BUPERS), Administrative and Media Enlisted Community Manager (ECM) (BUPERS-326) manages the health and eligibility requirements of the CRF community.

5. Eligibility

- a. The CRF is open to personnel who are currently assigned to recruiting duty with Navy enlisted classification (NEC) codes 803Rand 805R and to personnel who have previously completed a successful tour as a recruiter and desire to convert to the Navy counselor (recruiter) (NCR) rating (NECs 800R and 801R).
 - b. Personnel must meet the following eligibility guidelines:
 - (1) Have no marks below 3.0 in previous 3 years of performance evaluations,
 - (2) Must be in pay grades E-5 through E-7,
- (3) Meet current screening requirements for recruiters per reference (a), MILPERSMAN 1306-964,
- (4) Have a favorably completed and adjudicated National Agency Check with Local Agency Check and Credit Checks per reference (b) or a case type tier 3 per reference (c),
 - (5) Current commanding officer's (CO) endorsement,
- (6) Per reference (d), complete personnel qualification standards (PQS) for advanced recruiter. Recruiter in charge (RinC) and advanced officer recruiter are highly encouraged,
- (7) If a Sailor is requesting a component change, he or she must be within 12 months of his or her end of active obligated service (EAOS), refer to reference (a), MILPERSMAN 1306-1502 for details),
 - (8) Must have minimum of 12 months onboard, if currently assigned to recruiting duty,
- (9) Per reference (e), must be within physical readiness standards, either having passed or been properly waived from the last 3 years of physical fitness assessments (PFA). Sailors with a PFA failure in the 3-year period preceding application will not be considered for conversion.

- (10) No non-judicial punishment, court-martial conviction, civilian conviction, significant involvement with civilian authorities, or moral or integrity violations within the past 72 months. Waivers may be authorized on a case-by-case basis by BUPERS-326,
- (11) If serving on a selective reenlistment bonus enlistment, the member must be within 9 months of EAOS to be eligible for lateral conversion. Per reference (f), conversion must not take place earlier than 3 months prior to EAOS,
- (12) If receiving continuous submarine pay (CONSUBPAY) while on shore duty, members will have their CONSUBPAY terminated as of the date of selection. If receiving CONSUBPAY on sea duty, members will no longer be eligible as of the date of selection. Members will commence receiving operational submarine pay on a month-by-month basis until detachment,
- (13) If selected, member's projected rotation date (PRD) may be adjusted but not to exceed a total of 48 months at current Navy Talent Acquisition Group (NTAG) or Reserve Talent Acquisition Group (RTAG). Request for PRD adjustments must be requested, via NAVPERS 1306/7 Enlisted Personnel Action Request, to Navy Personnel Command (NAVPERSCOM), Career Recruiter Leading Detailer (PERS-4010C), and
- (14) Nuclear-power-trained personnel who lose their NECs or are permanently removed from the Navy Nuclear Power Program are eligible for conversion.
 - c. The following personnel are not eligible to apply:
 - (1) Personnel in receipt of permanent change of station (PCS) orders,
 - (2) Personnel with an approved Fleet Reserve date,
- (3) Reserve personnel not able to complete 20 years of active-duty service prior to reaching age 60, or
 - (4) Personnel with less than 36 months to high year tenure from their PRD.

<u>Note</u>: Waivers are not authorized for eligibility requirements in paragraph 5 with the exception of subparagraph 5b(10).

6. Active or Reserve CRF Programs

a. Active or Reserve CRF Management (NEC 800R)

- (1) Personnel assigned to NTAGs must have completed advanced recruiter PQS and be qualified as a recruiter per reference (d). RinC and advanced officer recruiter are highly encouraged.
- (2) Personnel selected for active or reserve CRF Management will attend the CRF Leadership Academy upon transfer from their current duty station.
- (3) RC personnel selected for CRF Management are subject to PCS transfer within 12 months of selection.

b. Active or Reserve CRF Hometown Recruiter (CRFHR) (NEC 801R)

- (1) Personnel may only apply while currently serving on recruiting duty.
- (2) CRFHR selectees are not eligible for PCS transfers. Members selected will not transfer from current duty station unless selected for E-7. Those selected for E-7 will be automatically subject to PCS transfer and immediate conversion to active or Training and Administration of the Reserves (TAR) Management CRF (NEC 800R).
- (3) Personnel must have completed PQS for advanced recruiter and be qualified per reference (d). RinC and advanced officer recruiter are highly encouraged.
- 7. <u>Application Procedures</u>. Personnel desiring conversion to CRF must submit NAVPERS 1306/7 to BUPERS, Enlisted Community Management Division (BUPERS-32) via their CO, requesting release from their community for CRF conversion consideration. Applicant NAVPERS 1306/7s are forwarded by BUPERS-32 to the applicant's respective ECM for considering community release for conversion. If released, members have 30 days from the date of approval to submit their application, via their CO, directly to NAVCRUITCOM, Career Recruiter Force Program Manager (N115).
 - a. Application must include the following:
 - (1) CO's endorsement (sample provided in enclosure (1)) as a minimum, must include:
- (a) Comment on the applicant's potential for leadership in positions of increased Responsibility,

- (b) Certification that the applicant meets all physical readiness standards per reference (d). A statement regarding the applicant's compliance with height, weight, and body composition assessment standards is required,
- (c) Certification of the position(s) that the member qualified in while on recruiting duty (certification must clearly identify the command that issued it), and
- (d) NEC recommendation CRF Management (NEC 800R) or CRF Hometown (NEC 801R).
 - (2) Chief recruiter's (CR) endorsement (if currently on recruiting duty),
- (3) NAVPERS 1306/7 (must state CRF Management (NEC 800R) or CRF Hometown (NEC 801R),
- (4) Copy of signed NAVPERS 1070/613 Administrative Remarks entry stating: "If selected for CRF, I agree to incur 36 months of obligated service from the date of assignment as a CRF." This must be signed by the member and witnessed,
 - (5) Applicant's letter stating why he or she desires to be a CRF,
- (6) NAVPERS 1306/7 signed by the CO (cannot be "by direction"). Member must state "request for CRF Management (NEC 800R) or CRF Hometown (NEC 801R)."
- (7) If not currently assigned to recruiting duty per reference (a), MILPERSMAN 1306-946, a copy of NAVPERS 1306/93 Recruiting Duty Screening. If Service member has visible tattoos, ensure compliance with reference (g),
 - (8) NAVCRUIT 1133/29 CRF Conversion Board Recruiter Statistics Worksheet,
- (9) Full-length color picture, front and back, of member in the service uniform. Photographs will be taken uncovered against a contrasting background with the applicant's name and date. The date the photograph was taken must appear in the photograph, and
- (10) Copy of Physical Readiness Information Management System (PRIMS) report showing physical fitness assessment results for 3 years prior to application date.

Note: Ensure social security numbers have been removed from all documents (blackened).

8. Conversion

- a. An administrative conversion board will be held as needed and as determined by Commander, Navy Recruiting Command (COMNAVCRUITCOM) to consider applicants for conversion to CRF.
- b. The conversion board will consist of a minimum of three CRF master chief petty officers and an O-4 through O-6 to serve as the board's president. NAVCRUITCOM (N1) will notify applicants of selection via naval message.
- c. Active duty CRF selectees currently on recruiting duty will be immediately converted to CRF (NEC 800R or NEC 801R).
- d. RC CRF selectees (NEC 800R and 801R) will be released from their current reserve enlistments and enlisted into the TAR or AC community, as directed by naval message, within 30 days of the date of the naval message. The initial term of enlistment will be for 36 months.
- e. Fleet selectees for CRF Management will be immediately assigned temporary NEC 2199 and transferred at their current PRD. Members will attend the CRF Academy in conjunction with PCS orders and will be converted to CRF (NEC 800R) upon successful completion. Fleet personnel will take their current rating examinations until successfully graduating from the CRF Academy. For any modification to current PRD, members must submit NAVPERS 1306/7 to NAVPERSCOM, Shore Special Programs Distribution Branch (PERS-4010) via their chain of command.
- 9. <u>Assignment</u>. Contact PERS-4010C for guidance on assignment policies and procedures and to discuss future duty preferences. Duty assignments will be made using the following guidelines.
- a. Prior to issuance of orders, per reference (a), MILPERSMAN 1306-965, a completed NAVPERS 1306/92 Special Programs Screening Form must be forwarded to PERS-4010C within 30 days of receipt of the screening message.
- b. Approved applicants will be assigned permanently to the CRF community for the remainder of their naval career, unless approved for rating reversion or submitted for forced conversion due to loss of confidence in their ability to perform as a career recruiter. Reference (h) provides force conversion procedures.

- c. Upon notification of approval, new Active and Reserve Management CRF (NEC 800R and 801R) members should attend CRF indoctrination (INDOC). During INDOC, CRF detailer will be present and assist new convert how to choose order in MyNavy Assignment System. INDOC should be conducted during application phase or selection phase. CRF's should contact NAVPERSCOM (PERS-4010C) at: (COM) (901) 874-2352 to negotiate orders to an NTAG or RTAG if unable to attend INDOC.
- 10. <u>Points of Contact</u>. For questions pertaining to CRF application procedures, conversion process, or career opportunities, contact BUPERS-326 at: (COM) (901) 874-2978.

11. Records Management

- a. Records created as a result of this instruction, regardless of format or media, must be maintained and dispositioned for the standard subject identification codes (SSIC) 1000, 2000, and 4000 through 13000 series per the records disposition schedules located on the Department of the Navy/Assistant for Administration (DON/AA), Directives and Records Management Division (DRMD) portal page at: https://portal.secnav.navy.mil/orgs/DUSNM/DONAA/DRM/Records-and-Information-Management/Approved%20Record%20Schedules/Forms/AllItems.aspx . For SSIC 3000 series dispositions, please refer to part III, chapter 3, of Secretary of the Navy Manual 5210.1 of January 2012.
- b. For questions concerning the management of records related to this instruction or the records disposition schedules, please contact your local records manager or the DON/AA DRMD program office.
- 12. Review and Effective Date. Per OPNAVINST 5215.17A, NAVCRUITCOM (N1) will review this instruction annually around the anniversary of its issuance date to ensure applicability, currency, and consistency with Federal, Department of Defense, Secretary of the Navy, and Navy policy and statutory authority using OPNAV 5215/40 Review of Instruction. This instruction will be in effect for 10 years, unless revised or cancelled in the interim, and will be reissued by the 10-year anniversary date if it is still required, unless it meets one of the exceptions in OPNAVINST 5215.17A, paragraph 9. Otherwise, if the instruction is no longer required, it will be processed for cancellation as soon as the cancellation is known following the guidance in OPNAV Manual 5215.1 of May 2016.
