1. **Definitions**. For the purpose of categorizing suiciderelated behaviors, the following definitions apply:

a. Suicide. Death caused by self-directed injurious behavior with any intent to die as a result of the behavior.

b. Suicide Attempt. A non-fatal self-directed potentially injurious behavior with intent to die as a result of the behavior. A suicide attempt may or may not result in injury.

c. Other Suicide-Related Behaviors. Expressed suiciderelated thoughts, suicide-related communications, and non-fatal self-injurious behavior without evidence of intent to die.

2. <u>Reporting</u>. Per reference (a), all suicide-related behaviors, regardless of outcome, must be reported following the procedures outlined in reference (b). Per reference (a), after a suicide-related behavior, commands are required to submit a referral to the Sailor Assistance and Intercept for Life Program. All suicides and suicide attempts require the completion of the Department of Defense Suicide Event Report (DoDSER). For DoDSER reporting requirements please see reference (a).

3. Personnel Casualty Reporting Requirements. Per MILPERSMAN 1770-030, a personnel casualty report is only required for suicides and suicide attempts which result in serious injury. Reporting procedures are outlined in MILPERSMAN 1770-030. 4. <u>Suicide Prevention Coordinator Training</u>. Per reference (a), Suicide Prevention Coordinators (SPC) must receive Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV) approved SPC training within 90 days of designation.
