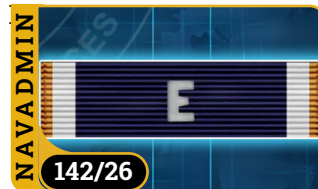

2025 FLEET AWARD WINNERS



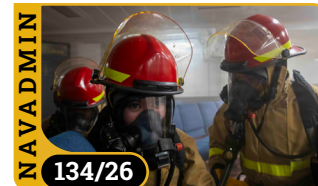

EXPANDED OPERATIONAL STRESS CONTROL AND WARRIOR TOUGHNESS



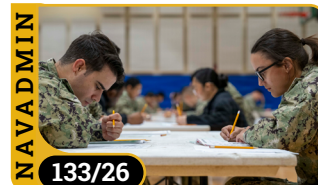

PCS GUIDE

START YOUR MOVE >>>

ARLINGTON, Va. — For Navy families, a new set of orders represents more than just a change of address—it signifies the start of a new chapter in service to the nation. To support these transitions, MyNavy HR released the 2026 Permanent Change of Station (PCS) Guide, designed to help Sailors and families stay ahead of the process from the day orders arrive through check-in at the next command.

"Family readiness is mission readiness," said Rear Adm. Kertreck V. Brooks, commander, MyNavy Career Center. "When Sailors know what paperwork, screenings and support resources are required up front, they can focus less on chasing answers and more on getting their families safely to the next duty station."

The 2026 guide consolidates critical policy updates to streamline the PCS process and puts more emphasis on early action. It includes expanded family preparation and medical screening information, especially for Sailors moving overseas or to remote locations. Sailors can find helpful tips on all the moving parts during a PCS, like family preparation, medical and overseas screenings, personal property moves, pay and more.

A major financial update is the use of the government travel charge cards (GTCC). As of October 2025, GTCC is required to be used for PCS travel with some exceptions. Sailors should use the card only for authorized expenses, keep itemized receipts, and submit completed travel claims within five days of arrival.

The guide also highlights changes to personal property support, including the Department of War Personal Property Activity (PPA), which now supports global household goods and vehicle shipment, storage-in-transit and non-temporary storage services. PPA was created as part of the DoW's commitment to giving warfighters and their families the information and resources they need.

"The move to a permanent Personal Property Activity gives service members and families a more enduring support structure for one of the most stressful parts of military life," said Maj. Gen. Lance G. Curtis, director, Department of War Personal Property Activity. "Our focus is making the moving process more accountable, more responsive and more centered on the people we serve."

For Sailors, the benefit is

direct: a more centralized personal property support structure, a clearer point of entry for help and expanded resources for household goods, personally procured moves, vehicle shipment and claims. Together, the PPA and the 2026 PCS Guide provide Sailors and their families additional support during one of the most challenging periods of military life.

"Sailors should not have to navigate PCS alone," Brooks said. "If a Sailor is unsure where to start, they can call us, email us or use MyNavy Portal to get connected to support."

Sailors can access the 2026 PCS Guide on the MyNavy HR PCS Resources webpage. For personnel, pay and transportation support, contact MyNavy Career Center. Or contact the PPA from May 15 to Sept. 15, during peak PCS season. Both resources are available 24/7.
